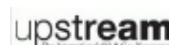

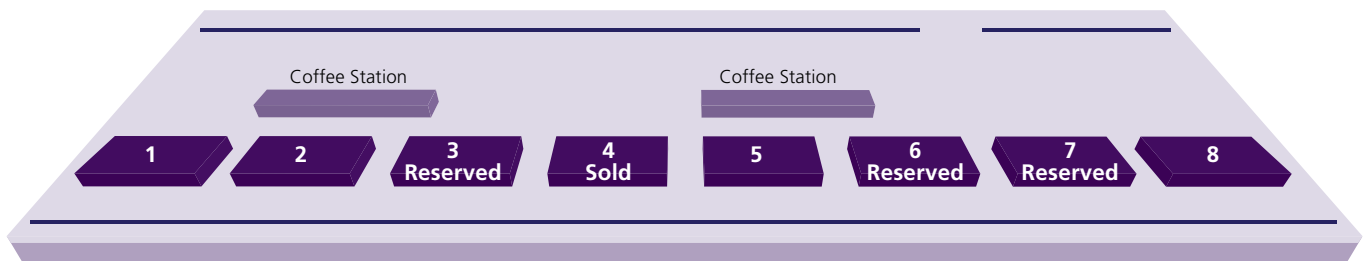

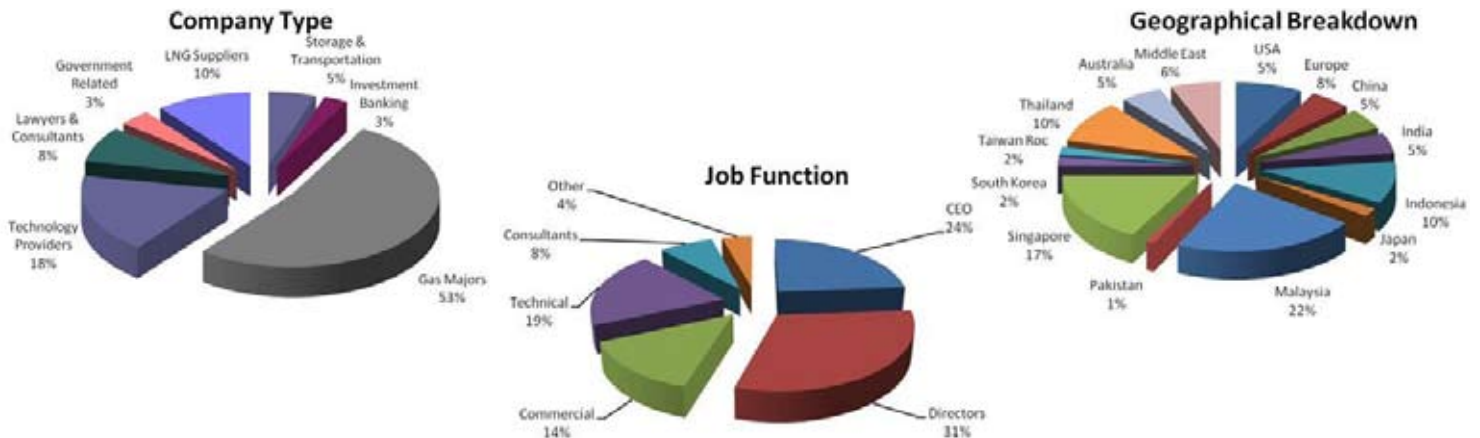
## EXHIBITION FLOORPLAN
